Fall 2025 Mission Giving

What a year 2025 has been! The Outreach Ministry thanks everyone for the generous outpouring of love and support for our many projects. **Here are some of the highlights:**

- Held an Emergency Food Drive to support South Windsor Foodbank (SWFB.) We collected 156 bags of food, hygiene products and paper goods. We also sent a check for \$500.
- Continued partnership as a Foodshare Distribution every other Thursday throughout the year. This culminated in our **Annual Foodshare Luncheon and Coat Distribution on December 4** where we served more than 100 people and distributed 100 coats.
- Working together, SPF and Outreach provided 8 Thanksgiving Dinners to SWFB.

WCC members and friends donated an outstanding amount of money (\$4,725) for gift cards for the holiday programs we traditionally do each year:

- 64 gift cards to SWFB in November for Thanksgiving
- 48 gift cards to MACC Joy of Giving in December
- 77 gift cards for Christmas Gifts for Children which were distributed by our Social Workers (Covenant to Care program)
- 70 Crop Walk walkers raised a total of \$7,344 with \$1,836 going to MACC

Other Donations and Events:

- WCC members donated \$2,170 to help Burke Ridge Farms after the devastating fire at their farm and \$2,500 to Tom Fraise following a very serious car accident in the Fall.
- Outreach provided \$250 to Cornerstone for children's socks.
- Provided gifts through our Touchstones program to 12 shut ins.
- Created and posted 42 new Banners from our Banner Ministry.
- Provided 49 Backpacks for Back to School (Covenant to Care.)
- Picked up and distributed Panera Bread donations 2-3 times a week.
- Held two Community Dinners serving 150 attendees and 35 volunteers at each dinner.
- Held six Foreign Policy Group "Great Decisions" group meetings.
- Prepared 75 CWS hygiene kits sent to Church World Service to use during crisis situations.
- Held a Midwest Food Bank day in January - a MLK intergenerational Service Activity.
- Collected 581 items for Undies Sunday for MACC.
- Held a VBS/Church Member Food Drive to benefit SWFB.
- Donated 150 Mother's Day Blanket through Church World Service.
- Collected \$915 for One Great Hour of Sharing.
- Shared our extra veggies this Summer with SWFB.
- Ongoing Stephen Ministry Christian Care and Prayer Shawl Ministry.
- Continued to support Scouts through our Bottle and Can Drives (see back page for more info!)

WCC Rings the Salvation Army Bells

In collaboration with the Hartford Kiwanis Club, WCC rang the bells in front of the Salvation Army kettle at the South Windsor Stop and Shop on Dec. 20 and 24 to raise a total of \$3,385. Peter DeMallie was joined by Nancy Calabrese, Anne DeMallie and Tim Wentzell from our church, and Mike Harris, RJ Winch and Linda King-Corbin from the Kiwanis Club. Captain Steven Salmon of the S.A. Northend Hartford Corps informed us that the Salvation Army delivered large bags of Christmas gifts to over 1,000 Hartford families (two per child), plus a dinner and on Christmas Day delivered dinner to 1,000 Hartford shut-ins. Scouting and Hartford Kiwanis Club Fundraising Update

In the Spring and Autumn, Wapping Community Church again collaborated with the Hartford Kiwanis Club to conduct two Hartford Scout Bottle & Can Drive fundraisers at the church. Total proceeds from these events was \$6,400. Funds are 100% used to help offset the programming costs for Hartford Girl Scout Troop 10036, Cub Scout Pack 2, and Boy Scout Troop 2. Without these monies, all three programs would be at risk.

The Girl Scout program also functions as Troop Double Dutch, for they compete nationally in Double Dutch competitions, and do quite well. They also see the world outside of Hartford. Behind the scenes, WCC has been meeting with a number of regional Scout leaders and Kiwanis Club members in order to arrive at a program to strengthen the two remaining Scout programs in the city. A third program recently shut down. Our emphasis is to add capable and committed adult scout leaders to Troop 2 so that the boy scouts can regularly meet on a weekly basis, rather than every two weeks, and then to increase the registered number of scouts and develop a well organized program to focus on merit badges and achieving the Eagle Scout Court of Honor for many of these future leaders.

WCC was also instrumental in securing a \$6,000 conditional grant from a South Windsor business to help facilitate this objective. During Advent we also collaborated with the Hartford Kiwanis Club on Saturday December 20, when we rang the bells for the Salvation Army in front of the iconic red kettle for over ten hours. By the end of the evening we had collected an amazing \$2,285 in cash donations, or an increase of \$883 from our Saturday before Christmas effort in 2024. We repeated the bellringing from 8 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. on Christmas Eve, and Captain Steven Salmon of the S.A. Northend Hartford Corps informed us that we collected another \$1,100 in donations. All in, donations averaged \$200 an hour for both days – nothing short of incredible.

Thanks to all who volunteered and generously donated to make all four events successful. These are just some of the many events undertaken by our church over the year to help those in need. Blessings. Peter R. DeMallie, proud member of Wapping Community Church.


